
HOW THE SCORES HAPPEN

Each country is scored according to five themes. Each theme has a number of sub-themes (a different number of sub-themes per theme). Each sub-theme is given a score. The sub-theme scores are added together to get a theme score. The five theme scores are added together to get a country score.


